ORDER

THIS CAUSE came before the Court *sua sponte*. On May 8, 2018, Plaintiff, Grisel Alonso, filed a Motion for Summary Judgment as to Victor Elmaleh [ECF No. 66], and a separate Motion for Summary Judgment as to Mercedes Elmaleh [ECF No. 67]. Pursuant to Local Rule 7.1(c)(2), “[f]iling multiple motions for partial summary judgment is prohibited, absent prior permission of the Court.” S.D. Fla. L.R. 7.1(c)(2) (alteration added). Plaintiff has not sought such permission from the Court, nor is the Court inclined to grant it.


Rather, to better manage the orderly progress of the case, a single combined motion shall be filed. Should the analyses diverge, Plaintiff may present the respective arguments in subsections within the combined motion. Plaintiff may exceed the page limits set forth in the Local Rules by five pages, if necessary, to adequately present her arguments.

Accordingly, it is **ORDERED** that the Motions for Summary Judgment [ECF Nos. 66 & 67] are **DENIED without prejudice**. Plaintiff shall submit a single combined Motion by **May 11, 2018**. Given Defendants have agreed to entry of final judgment against them (*see* Letter [ECF No. 63]), Plaintiff shall attach as exhibits to the Motion a proposed order on the Motion and a

proposed final judgment, and email the proposed orders to altonaga@flsd.uscourts.gov in Word format.
